



Crash Trend

December to February




The trend of count of Crashes for Date Time Reported (MY). The view is filtered on Date Time Reported (MY), which keeps December 2023, January 2024 and February 2024.

From December 1st to February 29th, WPD responded to an average of 78 accidents per month.

WPD officers have displayed their dedication to reducing these numbers through their enforcement efforts, conducting an average of 507 traffic stops per month.






There were 80 total vehicle crashes in the month of January, with 39 Accident Reports completed. Nearly half of the accidents were non-reportable.

The highest crash hours in February were 12pm and 5pm.

Sector 4 had the highest number of crashes at 30 for the month, followed by Sector 3, 1, then 2. There were two crashes located on the Downtown Mall (sector 5) and 1 crash on Airport Road in Frederick County.




In the month of February, there were 522 total traffic stops, resulting in 228 Citations, 267 Warnings, 26 with No Enforcement, and 1 Arrest. There were also 12 DUI Arrests made.


Note: DUI Arrests are not always a result of a Traffic Stop and are sometimes a result of a Traffic Crash.

The top reasons for Traffic Stops are Failure to Obey Highway Signs/Markings and Lane Markings, followed by Expired Registration, Speeding 10-14 MPH Over and 15-19 Over, and Driving without a License.

Top Reasons for Traffic Stops








Winchester Police Department February Distracted Driving Heat Map

In February, there were 13 Citations and 17 Warnings written for distracted driving, making a total of 30.

3 were under the new City Code 14-35, while the others were under the State Charge Section Code 46.2-818.2.
