



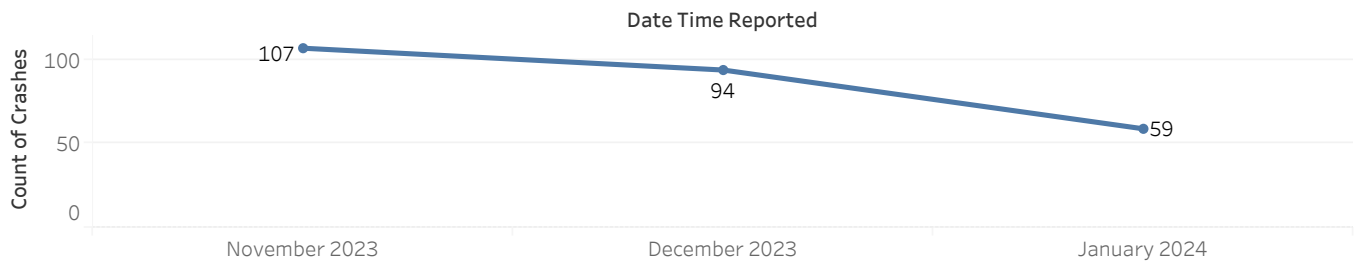

## Crash Trend

November to January



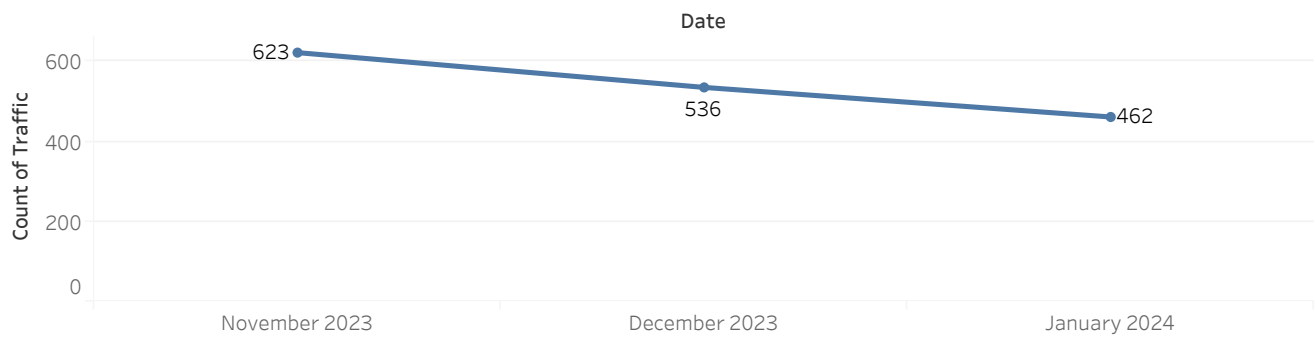
The trend of count of Crashes for Date Time Reported (MY). The view is filtered on Date Time Reported (MY), which keeps November 2023, December 2023 and January 2024.

From November 1st to January 31st, WPD responded to an average of 87 accidents per month.

WPD officers have displayed their dedication to reducing these numbers through their enforcement efforts, resulting in a 45% decrease in crashes from November to January.

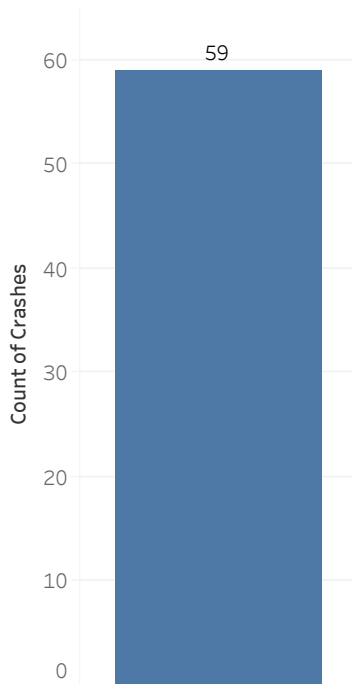

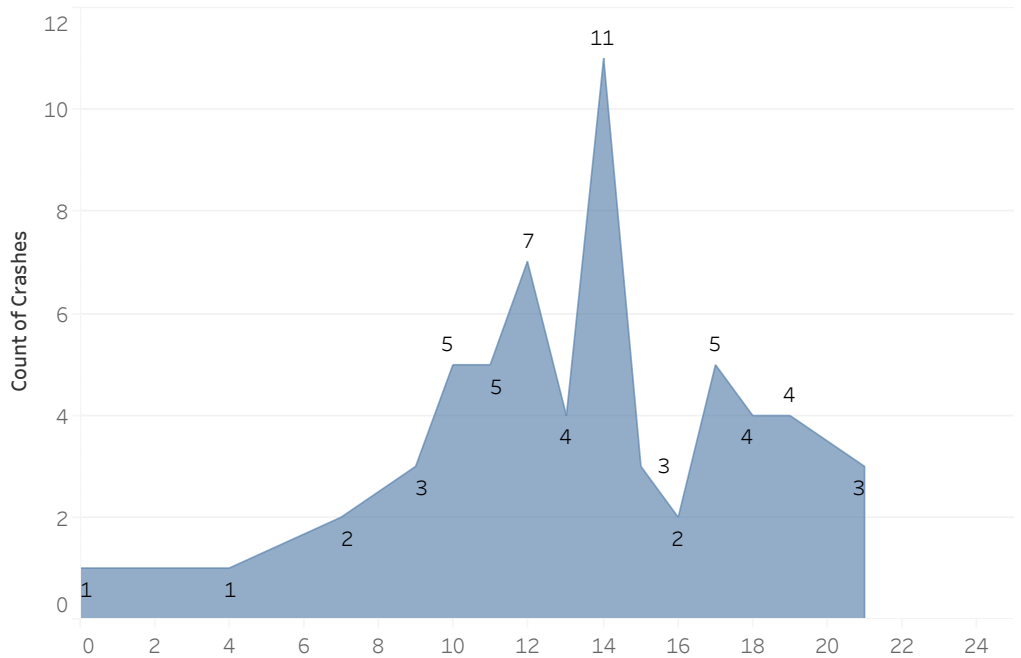

### Crashes by Time

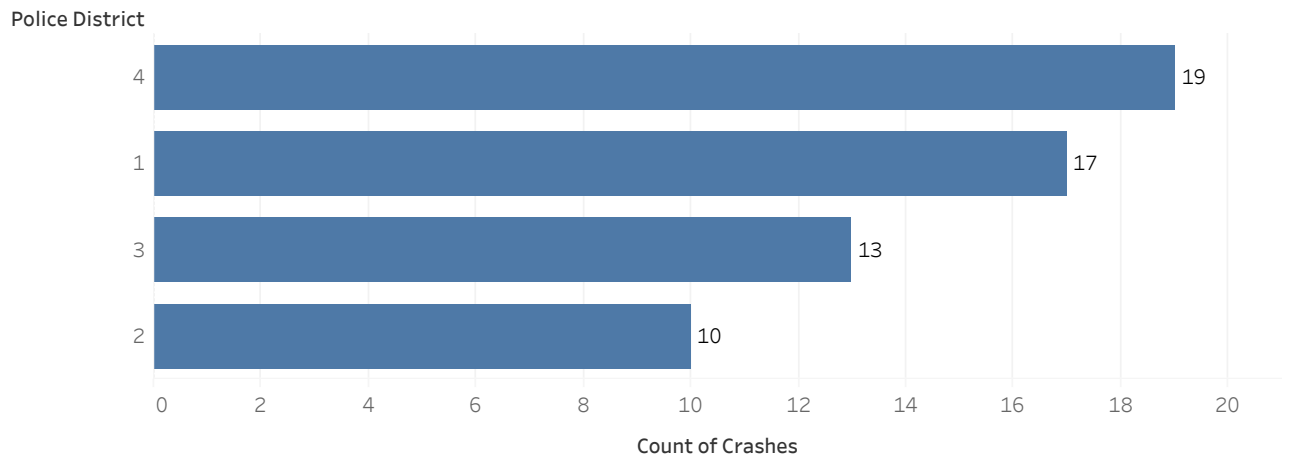


There were 59 total vehicle crashes in the month of January, with 31 Accident Reports completed. Nearly half of the accidents were non-reportable.

The highest crash hour in January was 2 pm.

Sectors 4 had the highest number of crashes at 19 for the month, followed by Sector 1, 3, then 2.

### Crashes by Sector



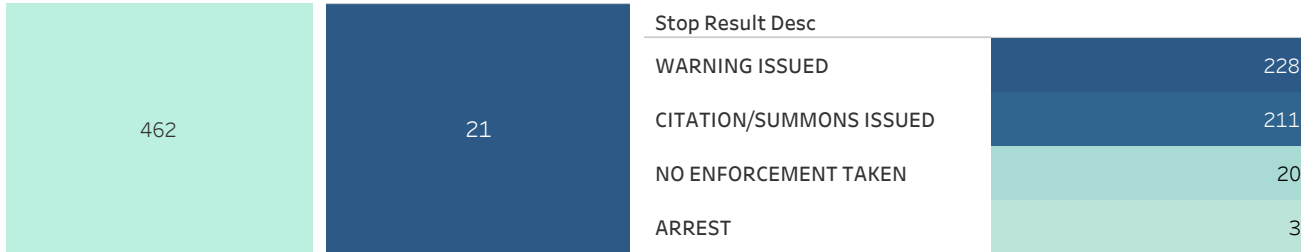

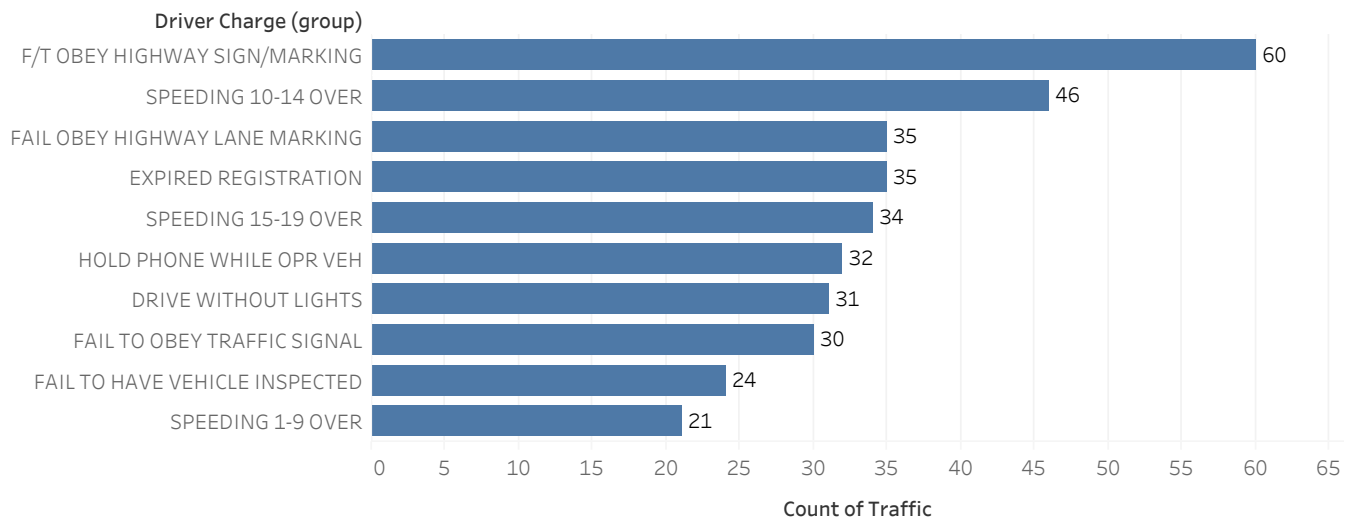


In the month of January, there were 462 total traffic stops, resulting in 211 Citations, 228 Warnings, 20 with No Enforcement, and 3 Arrests. There were also 21 DUI Arrests made.

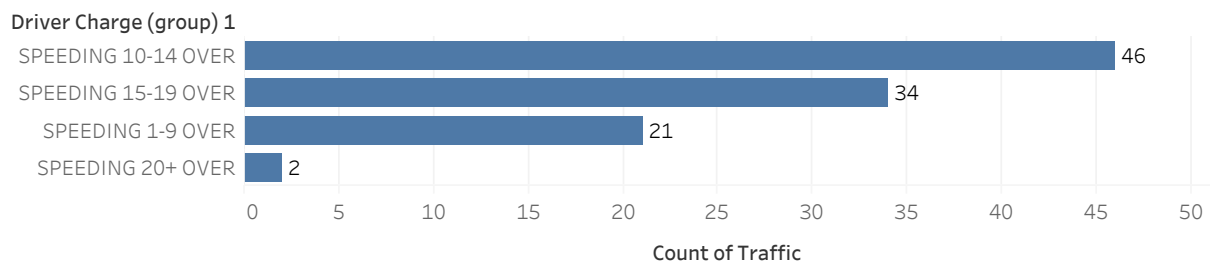
Note: DUI Arrests are not always a result of a Traffic Stop and are sometimes a result of a Traffic Crash.

The top reasons for Traffic Stops are Failure to Obey Highway Signs/Markings, followed by Speeding 10-14 MPH Over, Failure to Obey Lane Markings, and Expired Registration.

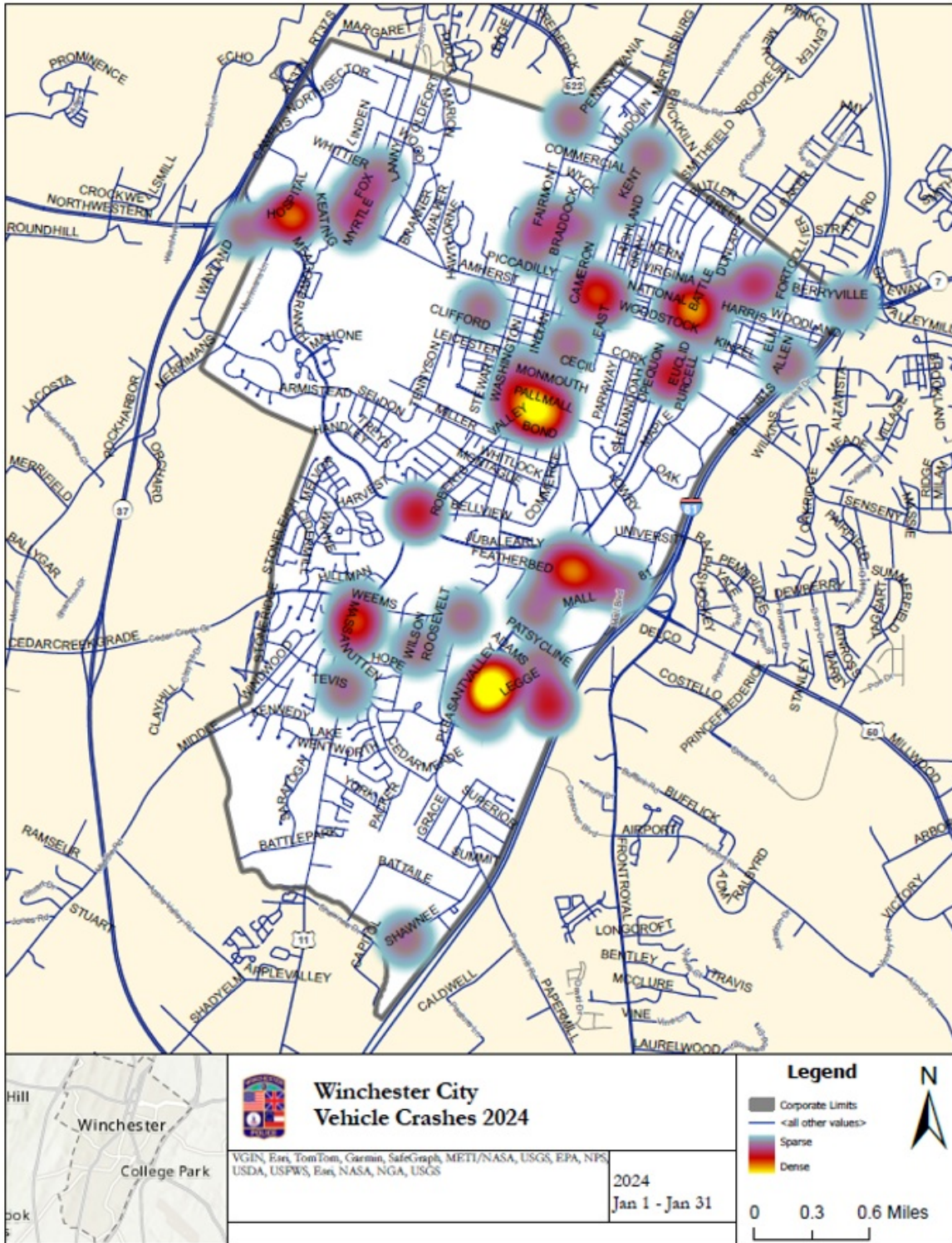

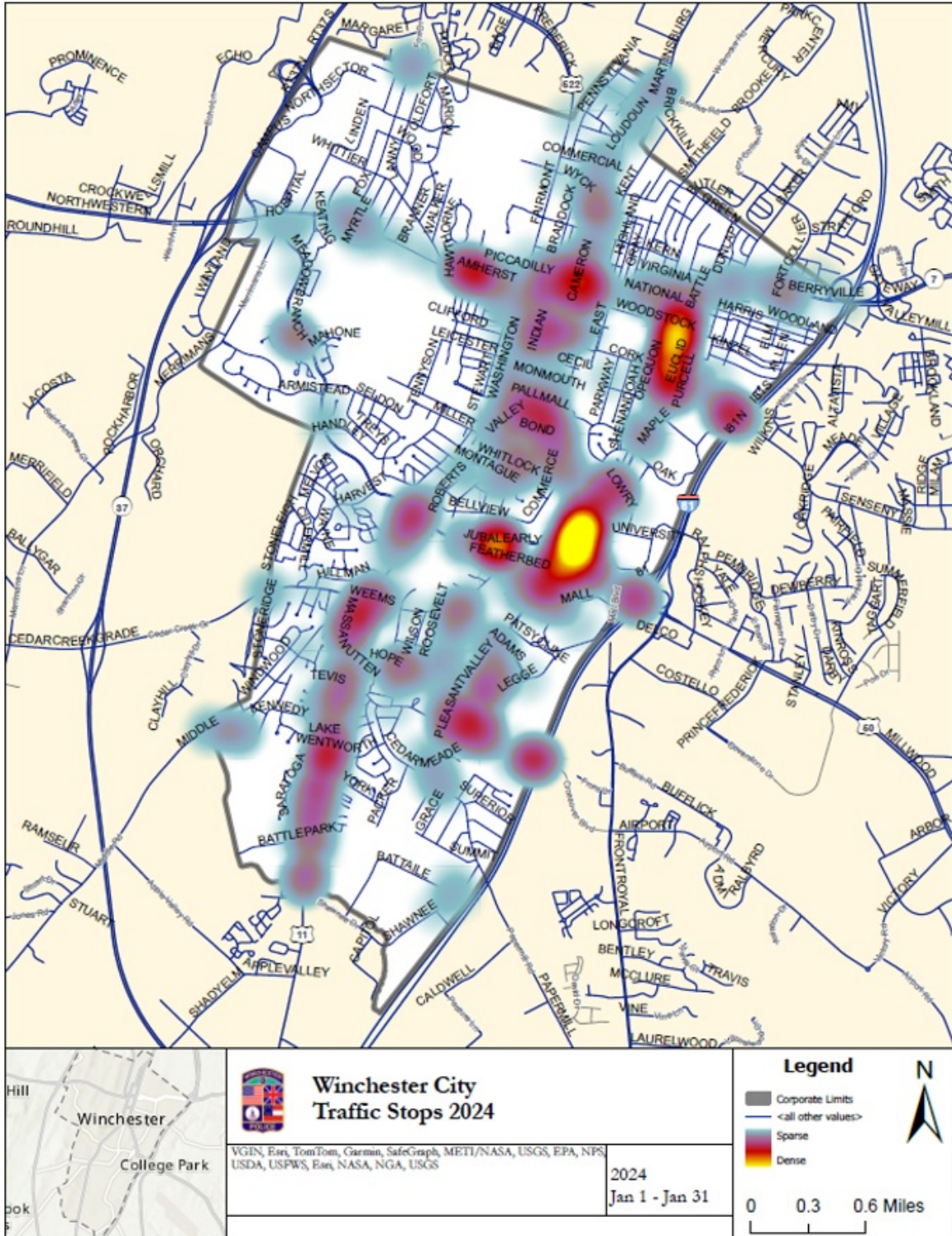
